Apart from the magnificent scenery and splendid boating facilities of this glorious region, you will find a remarkable range of attractions to enjoy throughout the seasons. Here are just a few of the things you might want to experience along the way:

DAY ONE

- Pick up boat in Belturbet and head for Upper Lough Erne
- Visit the Crom Estate National Trust, one of the most important nature conservation sites in the UK. The beautiful lakeside demesne is home to ancient woodland, freshwater habitats, rare butterflies and the largest heronry in Ireland.
- Stop off at Inis Rath Island home to the Krishna Spiritual Community. Peacocks, herons, deer, squirrels inhabit this peaceful island. The Vedic Temple gives an experience of ancient India.
- Join in a bit of canoeing at the Share Holiday Village

DAY TWO

- Do a one day cookery course at the award winning Belle Isle School of Cookery
- Moor up at the 4* Killyhevlin Hotel and go for a luxury spa treatment and a spot of lunch

DAY THREE

- Spend a day in the beautiful island town of Enniskillen: Visit the Buttermarket Craft & Design Centre, Enniskillen Castle Museums, take a Walk & Talk Tour of Enniskillen with a local tour guide and go for lunch in one of the fabulous restaurant & cafes along the quaint Main Street
- Visit Devenish Island on Lower Lough Erne. Founded in the 6th Century by St Molaise, today visitors can view extensive ruins including a 12th Century Round Tower, Augustinian Abbey, St Molaise's House and a graveyard with an unusual mid 15th Century carved cross.

DAY FOUR

- Go for a walk around the grounds of Tully Castle. Explore the beautiful gardens, the surrounding woodland and the ruins of the Castle itself.
- Visit White Island where you will see the remains of a 12th Century church with 8 enigmatic figures carved in stone dating back to the 6th Century.
- Moor up at Lusty Beg Island and take part in some off-road driving or just take a leisurely walk around the 75 acre island before indulging in a spot of lunch.

DAY FIVE

- Stop off at Castle Cauldwell and meander through the beautiful forest walks and take in the scenery of the surrounding Fermanagh Countryside
- Cruise on down to the quaint village of Belleek and visit the World Famous Belleek Pottery. Take a guided tour and see first hand the making & painting. Talk to the crafts people, visit the museum, tearooms and take home a gift from the extensive showroom.
