Enniskillen Castle

Explore Fermanagh's unique stories within the picturesque setting of Enniskillen Castle beside the River Erne. Discover diverse histories within the castle walls from Medieval Stronghold to Plantation Castle to later Military Barracks. Today, the historic Castle complex houses two Museums, Fermanagh County Museum and The Inniskillings Museum, forming Enniskillen Castle Museums. The Castle is open daily for public tours and is bookable online <u>here</u>

Headhunters Barber Shop & Railway Museum

Lovingly collected and preserved by the Johnston family, this museum recalls the bygone years of Fermanagh rail travel. The reconstructed Booking Office, General Manager's Office and extensive collection of railway memorabilia evoke memories of a rural rail service which ceased operation in 1957

Enjoy the Eco Forest Spa on the edge of Lough MacNean. Warm your bones and enjoy the spectacular views from our woodfired hot tub, lakeside sauna & relaxation pod. Some well deserved outdoor indulgence... Take time out, slow down & connect with nature. This unique experience will sooth your mind, relax your body and rejuvenate your soul. Afterwards, choose to explore the surrounding area via Ebike. Explore the untapped wilderness, discover megalithic tombs hidden in the forest and enjoy the sweeping views over the lake and its islands with an Electric Mountain bike.

Day Two Marble Arch Caves

Go underground at the Marble Arch Caves and explore one of Europe's finest show caves allowing visitors to explore a fascinating, natural underworld of rivers, waterfalls, winding passages and lofty chambers. Both Marble Arch Caves and the nearby Cuilcagh Mountain Park are jointly recognised jointly as a UNESCO Global Geopark due to the world importance of their geology and landscapes. The site is the only UNESCO Geopark in Northern Ireland and is made up of multiple sites which spraddles the NI and ROI border.

Island Discovery

The Island Discovery pontoon boat is the first of its kind on the Island of Ireland. Island Discovery is a 4 pod boat offering seating & tables for up to 12 passengers. This unique boat provides breathtaking panoramic views of Lough Erne and its shore line, offering visitors a silent, all-electric ecofriendly motor experience and is the best way to appreciate the views and hear the distinct sounds of our waterway. Florence Court House

Florence Court House, named after St. John Cole's wife Florence Bourdieu, is situated approximately 8 miles from Enniskillen. The house, formerly the home of the Cole family, Earls of Enniskillen, is surrounded by a large area of gardens, parkland and woodland, with breath-taking views to Benaughlin and the Cuilcagh Mountains. With its classical style and exquisite rococo plasterwork, Florence Court is one of Ulster's most important 18th-century houses. The gardens are home to the famous Florence Court Yew - reputed-ly the 'parent' of all Irish yew trees. The original tree (Taxus baccata "Fastigiata") was discovered circa 1760.

Explore the estate by bike and learn more about the history of the Kitchen Garden and how it played its role in making Florence Court one of the finest examples of a sustainable Irish estate.

Now to eat... Located in a secluded corner on the edge of Florence Court Estate in the foothills of Benaughlin Mountain, <u>Tully Mill Restaurant</u> is a hidden gem when it comes to dining in County Fermanagh. The picturesque restaurant is under the management of local chef, John Roche, who serves up a traditional menu with modern twists, using local and seasonal produce.

The Boatyard Distillery is an award-winning farm-to-bottle distillery located on the banks of Lough Erne. Their gin botanical, Sweet Gale, is foraged from the family bog and the wheat used for our vodka can be traced from the bottle back to the very field it came from. Founder, Joe McGirr, has utilised his background in spirits and whisky knowledge to build his dream of the first legal distillery in Fermanagh in over 130 years. Joe's dream to build a distillery in the place in which he grew up was inspired by his family's rich farming history. The sustainability efforts by the team here are second to none, which you will find out during this wonderful tour.

The craftsmanship and artistry of the pottery's workforce elevated Belleek china to international renown. Original and unique pieces are made using traditional methods passed down from generation to generation.
